
**LCWSA Regional Water Supply Project
Public Information Opportunities**

Dear Property Owner:

The Livingston County Water and Sewer Authority (LCWSA) would like to invite you to attend an upcoming Public Information Opportunity to learn more about the LCWSA Regional Water Supply Project. Your property is located on one of the potential routes for a future water transmission main associated with this important regional infrastructure project.

The Regional Water Supply Project is currently in the design phase and is intended to improve long-term water supply resiliency, reliability, and regional interconnectivity throughout Livingston County. Construction of the first project components is anticipated to begin as early as Spring 2027.

Public Information Opportunities

To provide residents with multiple opportunities to learn about the LCWSA Regional Water Supply Project, the Authority will be hosting both a virtual information meeting and an in-person open house. Residents are welcome and encouraged to attend either event or both events, depending on their interest and availability. Virtual Information Meeting

A virtual meeting will provide an overview of the Regional Water Supply Project, including its purpose, current design status, anticipated schedule, potential benefits to residents, and opportunities for future public water service connections. A question-and-answer session will follow the presentation.

In-Person Open House

LCWSA will be hosting at least two in-person Open House's which will provide residents with an opportunity to meet one-on-one with LCWSA staff, project engineers, and project representatives. Attendees will be able to review project maps, discuss potential transmission main routes, ask questions, and learn more about how the project may affect properties located along the proposed corridors. We anticipate that there will be two Open House's scheduled, one in October and one in November. Once finalized, the dates will be published on the project webpage.

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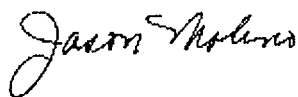
At our In-Person Open House, residents will have the opportunity to meet with LCWSA staff and project engineers to:

- Learn about the purpose and benefits of the Regional Water Supply Project
- Review potential transmission main routes and project timelines
- Understand how the project may affect properties located along potential routes
- Ask questions and discuss concerns directly with project representatives
- Learn about the possibility of obtaining access to public drinking water service as a result of the project

It is important to note that the Regional Water Supply Project is **not a water district**. The project is focused on constructing regional transmission infrastructure that will enhance water supply reliability and create opportunities for future service connections. Property owners will **not be required to connect** to public water service if they choose not to do so.

Whether you attend virtually, in person, or both, we encourage you to participate and learn more about this important regional infrastructure investment. Please check the website periodically, as it is updated regularly with new information and project developments.
